

Our guarantee of quality is in the words 'PALAKONA', 'HOLLOKONA' and 'GLASKONA'. These are the trade-names we use to describe the different methods of construction employed in our rods.

About 'Palakona' Rods

'PALAKONA' was registered when the improved process which we now use for constructing split bamboo rods was invented. Since then we have refined the process until today we allow a smaller tolerance on rod dimensions than the average engineer would expect to meet on metal parts.

It has been no small task to bring our work to its present perfection. The difficulty in finding suitable bamboo is very great, and after trying samples of almost every known bamboo we have found districts which produce bamboos of the highest quality. These we use exclusively, and have agents on the spot, who select the choicest, and have them seasoned to our instructions in a special manner, which renders them exceedingly tough and springy. They are then shipped to us, only the very best of these being used for our trade, under the registered name of 'PALAKONA'.

This, then, is one item in the secret of the great spring, toughness and durability of our rods. But although the raw material is a very important matter, the great care and thoroughness of the work apparent in every detail add equally to the value and perfection of the rod. The method of construction and the high standard of the workmanship have much to do with the production of the perfect rod. By our improved method of building we ensure that all sections are quite true, perfectly tapered and absolutely fit together. Hardy's 'PALAKONA' rods stand alone.

HARDY'S 'HOLLOKONA' FLY RODS

These rods, designed as a result of a recent and important development in the manufacture of split cane, differ from our range of 'PALA-KONA' rods in that they are constructed on the 'hollow-built' principle, thereby combining extreme lightness with maximum strength and correctness of action.

HARDY'S 'GLASKONA' GLASS RODS

Our new 'GLASKONA' range of fly and spinning rods are constructed of the very latest and finest hollow-glass, and for strength, lightness, correctness of action and superb finish are unequalled.

Repairs to Rods, etc.

The wear and tear of a season's fishing often produce some little damage, and to avoid annoyance from such causes we strongly recommend you to return your rods etc., to us as soon as the season closes so that we may repair them in good time for the opening of the new season. Any such work will be done at as moderate a cost as possible.


When sending rods for repairs, kindly send the whole rod, attach a ticket to it with your name and address, and forward a letter under separate cover. (Note - we can accept for repair only tackle of our own manufacture).

Care of Rods

To keep your rods in good condition the following rules should be observed:—

After fishing dry your rod with a cloth and hang up or stand on end in a dry, airy room, if possible leaving it there until you fish again. Never leave your rod for long in the aluminium travelling container as this may cause serious damage. The same applies to leaving the rod in a damp place.

When assembling and dismantling your rod, always grasp the joints in the manner shown in the illustration on page 8, i.e. the hands close together, thumbs pointing upwards, one hand holding each of the male and female ferrules. Never hold the rod by the cane to separate the joints, as this may cause serious damage.



HARDY'S SPLINT-END 'SUCTION' JOINTS

These are the lightest form of rod joints and largely used on lightweight trout rods, where the weight is gauged by drachms. 'A' is the male ferrule. 'B' the female.

In fixing or releasing these joints, they should if possible be pushed straight in, with the rings in correct alignment. To release, simply pull straight out. If any difficulty, give a slight twist while pulling. The male ferrule 'A' is not made to go right home, but is fitted to within $\frac{3}{16}$ ".

HARDY'S MALE ROD JOINT PROTECTOR AND LUBRICATOR

It has always been customary to fit a corklined stopper to the female ferrules of the rod to protect them and prevent grit, etc. entering the joint. But why neglect the male ferrule? It is just as important and requires protection. Furthermore, it is desirable before putting the joints together, to lubricate them.

Illustration shows a perfect protector for the male ferrule, which is fitted with a lubricating cork lining. Keep your rod joints clean and correctly lubricated and you will avoid all joint trouble. Supplied to new or old 'Hardy' rods. It is necessary to send stoppers or impressions of female ferrule to ensure a perfect fit.

Suitable for 'Stud' lockjoints, 'Lockfast' joints and 'Suction' joints on trout and salmon rods.



HARDY'S 'STUD' LOCKJOINTS

This is a most perfect form of rod joint and a great improvement on any other design. When fixed it is an absolute lock in every possible way and can neither turn nor throw out.




FIG. 1 FIG. 3

Fig. 1 shows the joint in position to assemble. 'A' is a spring-operated stud; 'B' the hole into which 'A' locks.

To fix bring together as shown by Fig. 1, when stud 'A' will be automatically depressed by the guide 'C' of the female joint. When the male ferrule is home the stud 'A' is locked in the hole 'B'.

Fig. 2 shows how to dismount; simply press down 'A' with the thumb nail, give a slight twist, and pull apart, care being taken that the stud 'A' is completely depressed before making any effort to pull the joint apart.

HARDY'S 'LOCKFAST' JOINTS

With Left-Hand Spiral.

The majority of anglers in casting use the right hand, and give the rod a slight right-hand twist, which tends to undo the ordinary 'Lockfast' joint. To overcome this trouble we make all these joints with a left-hand spiral.

Fig. 1 is the male ferrule.

Fig. 2 is the female joint.

Fig. 3 is the joint assembled.

HARDY'S PATENT 'REVERSIBLE' SPEAR AND BUTTON



All anglers who use a spear on their rod know the bother there often was with the ordinary screw-in spear. It may have been left in the bag, or in a drawer at home—in fact, not there when wanted—and there was always the chance of losing it. The 'Reversible' Spear fits inside the butt of the rod when not in use and is secured by the button. To fix the spear—unscrew the button, reverse the spear through it and then screw the button to the rod with the spear extended for use.

Fitted to new trout rods when ordered and to old rods where the construction allows.

Spare parts, i.e., spear or button, can be supplied separately.

CHOOSING A FLY-ROD

When choosing a rod the important thing to remember is that there is no such thing as a low-priced 'bargain'. Always buy the very best you can afford and make sure that your equipment is suited to the job it is required to do. A skilful and experienced craftsman will always use first-class tools as they will help him very greatly to do a first-class job. Poor tools only fight against the user and hinder an efficient performance. Similarly, with fishing tackle, the tool is the fly, the cast, the line and the rod and reel. They are all parts of one tool and should not only be of the very finest possible quality and workmanship, but should be carefully matched to the job in hand.

In selecting a fly-rod the two main factors you must consider are length and action. Suitable length depends on the water to be fished, and should be considered in relation to the distance which you require to cast and the obstacles over which you may have to fish. For example, a very small river may require a rod of


about 7' to 8', but a wider river where longer casting is necessary will require a longer rod. A lake is generally better fished with a 10' rod, especially when fishing from the bank. The action of the rod depends on the weight of line which it is desired to cast, and this must be considered in relation to the size of the cast and fly used. For wet-fly fishing and relatively short casts a rod of medium action is suitable, but for dry-fly fishing a stiffer action is necessary to enable you to cast longer distances with accuracy. Such a stiff action will help you to throw into headwinds.



REPAIRS

Hardy Tackle is constructed to stand up to hard fishing, and if properly handled will give a lifetimes reliable service to its owner. The wear and tear of fishing, however, and the occasional accident can produce damage which, however slight, is always better attended to at once before it can develop into more serious damage. Should you be unfortunate enough to sustain damage to your Hardy Tackle, however slight, we seriously recommend you to have

putting it off until the end of the season. It is often extremely inconvenient to relinquish a favourite rod or reel in the height of the fishing season for repair, however if the rod is taken to one of our Branch Shops, or to an experienced Fishing Tackle Dealer who stocks our tackle, alternatively forwarded direct to us at Alnwick, an expert examination can disclose whether the damage is serious enough to warrant immediate repair or trivial enough not to be aggravated by a further use of the article until a convenient time to have it repaired. Should immediate repair work be necessary it is wiser to have it performed, despite the inconvenience, as this may save cost and trouble in the long run. We fully realise the urgency of repair work during the fishing season and we make every effort to ensure that repairs are completed and returned with the minimum delay. It must however, be realised that at very busy times, when there is a considerable pressure of work on our factory, it is not always possible to complete repair work as quickly as might be desired. The peak time for repair activity is just before and just after the opening of the Trout Fishing Season and is usually at its height about Easter. You can help us to give you the sort of service you require by wherever possible avoiding sending repairs at this time, unless it is absolutely necessary to do so. The best possible time to send rods for repair and overhaul is immediately after the close of the season, since this gives us time to perform the work thoroughly and carefully and return your tackle to you in good time for the opening of the next season. It will also be of assistance if you will state clearly when sending goods for repair the precise nature of the trouble so far as is known. Should you require goods examined and an expert opinion given as to what repair work is necessary, we shall be very glad to do this and to give an estimate for the cost of the necessary repairs. Please also note instructions on page 6 concerning the forwarding of repairs to Alnwick.




