



PROGRESS REPORT

by T. B. THOMAS



1957 was a year of great activity for Milwards. It was an exceptionally busy year for us, and a very considerable increase in the volume of our business was both convincing and satisfying proof that more and more anglers consider us the leading firm both for sound and ingenious design and for unsurpassed workmanship.

Not all our energy, however, was engaged in coping with this notable business increase. Much of our time was spent looking ahead in improving and perfecting the design of our tackle.

We believe we can quite honestly claim to have made far more progress in improving tackle, in the

last ten years at any rate, than any other firm. In support of this claim we would mention advances like the first use of Terylene, the so simple but ingenious knurled ferrule, the use of reverse tapers and staggered ferrules and the development of the RVU dressing, to quote but a few. Such advances can only come from people who really understand fishing and fishing tackle. From this point of view 1957 was a vintage year for us. Let us tell about our new products.

In the field of trout fly rods, we made a great advance last year when we introduced the staggered ferrule reservoir rod, the Flyrover SFR. By altering the ferrule position on this rod we succeeded in producing a rod of great power but one with a pleasant, untiring action that is both sensitive and kind to fine casts. Indeed one gentleman used it successfully on the Test with a 6x cast and size 000 flies.

When we started experiments with this rod, we also tried out the principle with others, and the Troutcraft SFR is the result. This is a rod with a wonderfully sweet, smooth action, exceptional balance and a most sensitive top. We caught a lot of trout last year when testing this rod and we know a lot of other anglers will do likewise this year.

A fly rod, of course, has to be a compromise. It has to cast, hook fish and play fish, and the best action for the one is not the best action for the others. In 1689, it was written in the Angler's Vade Mecum:

"The rod for fly must by no means be top-heavy; but very well mounted and exactly proportional as well as slender and gentle at the top: otherwise it will neither cast well, strike readily nor ply and bend equally."

In the Troutcraft SFR we think we have carried out this old but sound advice in a modern and ingenious manner.

On fly lines too, we have made great strides. You may recall nine years ago we put in our own braiding plant and pioneered the use of Terylene. At the same time we had the courage to attempt what no one had succeeded in doing in eighty years — finding a better dressing for fly lines than linseed oil. This was a tough nut — but we cracked it. It gave us a great deal of trouble, and expense, for we were dealing with materials about which little was known. 1957 saw us finally perfect the RVU 130 method. Our lines are now smoother and softer than any others with still of course the dual assets of great durability and the fact that they will not become sticky.

On the question of smoothness, incidently, did you know you can make a fly line too smooth? We knew we were eventually going to come up against this "smoothness barrier" and we arrived at this stage last year. Agate rings, of course, have a completely smooth polished surface. If you oppose this surface with another smooth one, in this case the line, you have a very high coefficient of friction and the line will not shoot.

Milward fly lines now have a discontinuous surface although you will not see the difference with the naked eye. This too leads to better grease retention and longer floating performance. Experiments on line surfaces are continuing and we think they will lead to further improvements in the future.

We are introducing one new size of fly line this year — the Flycraft HBGxxx. This line is designed for the EXPERT reservoir angler who can cast a very long line and pick up and control a "belly" much longer than that on our normal HBG. This will give much longer casts to the highly skilled caster.

On undressed lines too, we have made, and continue to make great progress. On page 4 you will see a photo of a machine of our own design and building. This machine enables us to produce braided lines which are smoother and finer, and even more remarkable, due to altering the molecular structure of the line material, considerably stronger. It also has given us a greatly increased output and for this reason we were able last season to reduce our prices.

There are two reasons why we are able to make progress of this nature on fishing lines. Firstly we are the ONLY firm of British Tackle Makers who actually braid their own lines. Secondly we have within our Group organisation research facilities available to no other tackle firm.

Our greatest progress we consider has been on float fishing rods. Indeed, in our new and quite revolutionary Swimversa, we think we have made the greatest progress yet made on rods of this type.

More and more float anglers, and in particular match anglers, are taking advantage of the fixed spool reel, and using the double handed cast, are casting float and tackle farther and farther. The normal "match" rod with the action confined to the tip, is a very bad casting rod but most anglers are satisfied to accept its shortcomings in this direction in order to obtain a very fast striking action. This two handed casting also, puts great strain on a stiff rod.

We have overcome this problem in this way. By making the butt of split cane with a reverse taper, that is, making it finer at the butt cap than at the top of the handle, we give the rod great casting power. Yet when the rod is held in the normal fishing position, all the flex is behind the hand and the rod has the fast tip action required. The position in which the rod is held along the very long handle too, controls the speed and "width" of the strike while again the flex in the butt acts as a cushion when playing a fish. All in all we think we can reasonably claim an exceptional piece of rod designing.

We were amongst the pioneers of hollow split cane rods, and our Troutmaster fly rods have earned an enviable reputation all over the World. For the last five years we have been experimenting with hollow float fishing rods and the Swimmaster is the result of this work. It is a very light 12 foot rod with a fine action. We are sure that it will be well accepted by the more expert float anglers.

Amongst our more successful rods is the Searanger $9\frac{1}{2}$ foot rod which we introduced but a few years ago. This has proven a most popular model, particularly for beachcasting with a large fixed spool reel. We have been asked for a similar





rod to cast up to six ounces. Our new $10\frac{1}{2}$ foot Searanger will carry this amount of lead and at the same time has the pleasant pliant action of the $9\frac{1}{2}$ foot model.

Finally let us tell you a little about tests carried out not so much to improve design, as to check the design of our more standard models. Last year, partly to check our own ideas but also because of some extraordinary statements in the sporting press to the effect that a light line can be cast farther than a heavier one, we held some fly casting tests. We invited a number of experienced trout and salmon fishermen, all un-biased, to act as "guinea-pigs" and we measured their efforts at both distance and accuracy with different outfits. The results of these tests we have recorded in a pamphlet entitled "Distance Data" which we will be pleased to send to any interested angler.

We mentioned a little earlier that fly rods (and indeed other rods too) must be compromises. We build our rods on a system of graduated tapers, in which the rod tapers throughout its length in a series of steps. These tests proved to us the soundness of our method. Although Milward rods have each a size of line that suits them best, and a distance at which they "cast themselves" our method of taper does make them effective from the very shortest cast up to the very longest. Furthermore, when conditions call for a very light line or a heavier one than usual, a Milward rod will still give good casting performance.

Milwards, as you will know, is a very old firm — one of the oldest of any type in this Country, in fact. We are only old in reputation and tradition however. We have, we believe, the most modern factory of its kind in Britain, and our workmanship too, we believe, is unsurpassed. In this report we have tried to show that we are also very progressive designers of fishing tackle. When you have seen some of the rods and lines we have mentioned in this report, we believe you will think so too. And, as actions speak louder than words, we are always delighted, by appointment, to show any angler our factory, our workmanship and our casting pool where any of our goods, new or old, can be tried out.

THE TROUTCRAFT SFR

A new and quite outstanding rod of both advanced and ingenious design.

The Troutcraft SFR is built on the staggered ferrule principle of a 3 ft. 11 in. butt and a $4\frac{1}{2}$ ft. top. By lowering the ferrule position from the middle of the rod, we have greatly improved both the action and balance, and a combination of the staggered ferrule and our normal system of graduated taper gives a rod in which any "bounce" in the butt is eliminated. The resultant action is as smooth and sweet as a one piece rod.

Even more important, the long, uninterrupted top gives a striking action that is positive, sensitive and sympathetic to fine casts.

This combination of exceptionally smooth casting action and firm but gentle hooking performance makes the Troutcraft a remarkably fine rod for all round trout fly fishing. Our system of graduated tapers too, permits it to throw easily either a very short line or a reasonably long one, giving a wide range of uses to include most types of fly fishing except long distance reservoir work.

THE SWIMVERSA


The float angler, be he "match" or "pleasure" fisherman, has in the past been content to accept the poor casting and playing performance of the stiff, tip action rod in order to obtain a very fast striking action. With modern methods, however, he is finding it more and more often necessary to cast float and tackle a long way, using a fixed spool reel and the double handed "punch" cast. Not only is the stiff rod unsuited for such work; it is also very likely to be damaged by strain for which it is not designed.

To overcome these difficulties, and give a rod which will do all the three jobs required of it efficiently, we have designed the Swimversa.

The main principle of the rod is that it has a split cane butt with a reverse taper under a long handle. That is to say that the rod tapers back from the start of the cork and is finer at the butt cap than at the handle top. This gives a great deal of spring to the butt and thus very great casting power, as shown in the little sketch. Used with the two handed cast the Swimversa will despatch float and tackle a very long way if required, with the easiest of swings.

All this casting power disappears, however, when the rod is held, in the normal fishing position, near the top of the handle as shown in the other sketch. The Swimversa has a middle joint of light stiff tonkin, and a split cane top with our Twin Taper Tip, and the strike in this position is very fast indeed for it is also helped by a slight reflex action from the spring in the butt. Furthermore, as you lower your hand and reel position down the butt, while the strike remains fast, it increases in

> fishing far off or in deep water. With the Swimversa then, you can actually "set" the amount of striking speed and action in

advance to suit conditions. To take full advantage of this fact and to give full casting power, the Swimversa has a very long 30 in. handle, without a rubber button. Such a button is a nuisance with this length handle.

Finally, when playing a big fish, the flex in the butt again comes into action, " cushioning " the fine top.

These are by no means all the advantages of this remarkable rod. The low casting action, for instance, causes float and shot to turn over rather like a fly line and prevents the bunched entry of float, shot and bait, "all in one lump." The butt action too, is a great help in "mending" line to avoid float drag.

Here then you have in ONE ROD a butt action for casting, a tip action for striking that is also adjustable for speed and "width" and a smooth curve for playing fish. A remarkable piece of design and a rod that is truly SWIMVERSATILE. Specification: Reverse taper Hexacane Butt.

THE FLYCRAFT HBGxxx LINE

This line is designed for the EXPERT reservoir long caster. It has a much longer belly than our normal HBG and in the hands of the man who can pick up and control a long length of heavy line, will give exceptionally long casts. To assist correct pick up, the end of the casting belly is marked in black.

We believe that a white line is the least visible to fish and the most visible to the angler. Because this line must be easily seen if it is to be controlled, the HBGxxx is only available in WHITE.

This line is also a fine line for salmon rods from 11 to 12 feet and suits our Flyranger 11 ft. 3 in. perfectly.

THE SWIMMASTER

Milwards were amongst the pioneers of hollow-building split cane, and for some years now we have been experimenting with float rods of this construction in a variety of lengths and actions. The Swimmaster is the result of these experiments and of the pooled opinions both of members of our Staff and other anglers all over the country who have tried these prototype rods.

Weighing only 11 ounces, the Swimmaster is an extremely light rod with a very fine fast action. Besides this fast sensitive tip, however, we have succeeded in building into this rod rather more casting action than is usual in a rod of this type.

Completely hollow throughout butt and joint, this rod is a fine example of master craftsmanship in rod building.

FLY AND SPINNING RODS

Design

Design begins on the river bank, and the expression "Designed by Anglers" has become a hackneyed one. Nevertheless, Milward Rods are designed by expert fishermen on our staff, backed by many years of experience and research, unsurpassed craftsmen, and a first-class, well-organised factory.

Material

Milward's split cane rods are made from "Hexacane." which is constructed as follows. The finest obtainable Tonkin bamboo is first "tempered" by our own process which improves both quality and strength. The cane sections are then cut on machines of our own design and building, to precision engineering limits, and laminated with urea-formaldehyde cement of a type exclusive to us. The bonding strength of this cement is so high that other than at the rings there is no necessity for whippings, which unnecessarily cover up the beauty of the natural cane, and the accurate work of master craftsmen.

Steel Centre

Modern rod-making methods have eliminated the need for this form of construction which in our opinion was never in any case a successful one.

Fittings

All rings, ferrules, reel fittings, etc., are made in these works by us, and their outstanding quality thus maintained. We use, where stated, genuine agate rings which are superior to those of any other material.

Our double-handed spinning rods are all fitted with our "Gripmaster" reel fittings which are fully described on page 38. This method is superior to the screw seat in function, and is lighter and much more comfortable to use.

The retaining rings on the reel fittings on our Spincraft Rods are tapered inside and lock the reel firmly in place. Screw fittings are therefore quite unnecessary on these rods, besides allowing the angler no choice of reel position, and being most uncomfortable in use.



Ferrules

All "Hexacane" Rods are fitted with our "Gripmaster" knurled ferrules, As will be seen in this illustration, a very firm grip can be obtained when putting up and taking down a rod. A simple idea; but one that has not been thought of before, and an indication of the thought and research which goes into our rods. We have probably had as much experience of various locking type ferrules as anyone in the trade and it is our considered opinion that sooner or later they always give trouble. A well made well fitted suction ferrule is a much better proposition particularly when knurled as our "Gripmaster" ferrules.



Action

It is impossible to describe accurately in words the action of rods, particularly fly rods, as the expressions stiff or medium do not mean the same to everyone. These expressions are therefore used in this catalogue only to differentiate between rods belonging to the same group, but having different actions. Rods that are too whippy or too stiff are tiring to use, for with rods of this type it is the user doing all the work, and not the rod. Our rods always come between these two extremes and combine power without losing sensitivity.

We would draw your attention to our remarks on maximum casting weights on page 37. You will also note that the maximum casting weight of each spinning rod is listed. This practice has been extremely well received by anglers everywhere as a means of preventing them overloading their rod and as a yardstick when selecting a rod for the particular job they have in mind.

Weight and Balance

Balance is MUCH MORE IMPORTANT than weight. This is not only our opinion; you will find it in the catalogues of the other top-class rod makers of the world. A light badly balanced rod is much more tiring than a heavier well balanced one. Our rods are made perfectly balanced, and as light as possible consistent with the job they have to do. Our Troutmaster Rods represent the ultimate in rod design and building, for their hollow construction makes them incredibly light.

The "Flymaster." This series of rods is designed, in the modern manner, for all round trouting. We show below the curve of a Flymaster when extended in the back cast. The discerning fisherman will note the power in the butt and centre of the rod, which can be developed fully if a long cast is required or a fish requires holding. He will also observe the smooth curve of the rod tip, so gentle on fine gut.

The great feature of these rods is that, in the two piece rods the butt, and in the three piece the butt and middle joint, are of hollow construction buttressed at scientifically estimated intervals by short sections of normal solid split cane. They are accordingly, extremely light while as powerful as much heavier rods of normal built cane construction.

These rods are difficult to make and are only handled by our most skilled craftsmen using special methods and machinery of our own design. Each rod represents the height of the rod builder's art and is accordingly expensive.



FLY RODS

The Flyrover. These outstanding rods were originally designed for Salmon fishing in Eastern Canada, where a single-handed rod is used and an extension grip required to give greater leverage when playing a fish, and for double handed-casting. They have also made a great name for themselves in New Zealand for big Rainbows, and indeed in many other parts of the world.

We introduced them to the Home Market a few years ago for Salmon fishing on the smaller rivers, for greased line work, and for big Sea Trout, and they have been

extraordinarily successful. We do not of course suggest these rods as substitutes for the normal double-handed Salmon rod, for the extra length and power of these are essential on many rivers. These are, however, powerful rods and despite their size, will handle big fish. A 32-pound Atlantic Salmon was landed on a 10 ft. Flyrover in the Mirimichi river in 1950, and we give below an extract from a letter about the pre-war model of the new Flyrover, which is an incredible testimonial. Specification:

For the last three years we have been giving a great deal of thought to the problems facing the ever growing number of Reservoir Trout fishermen. These anglers require a rod which will stand up to the very hard wear imposed by continuous long casting, often into a wind, and of picking up long and sometimes heavy lines. Indeed their requirements could be summarized by saying they required a Trout rod which would stand up to the wear and tear of Salmon fishing.

The obvious solution was a stiff powerful rod of the tournament type which would fulfil these requirements. Such rods, however, are not fishing rods and their action would be far from satisfactory in hooking and playing fish. Furthermore, such rods would be tiring and unpleasant to use for any length of time.

We therefore set about designing a rod which would have sufficient power for the requirements already described, and at the same time would be pleasant to use, which would hook and play fish well, and which could be used with reasonably light casts.

This we claim to have done successfully and one of the main reasons for the excellence of the rod is the fact that we have staggered the ferrule position. Instead of coming in the middle of the rod, and therefore right in the middle of the rod's bending action, we have dropped it farther down towards the butt.

The rod is 9 ft. 5 in. long to give plenty of clearance when fishing off dams and at $7\frac{3}{4}$ ounces is very light for the power it possesses. Because an extension butt makes playing a big fish much more comfortable, and because this rod is also ideal for Sea Trout and light Salmon fishing, we have included it in our Flyrover Series described overleaf.

When testing out this rod we found that using an HBG forward taper line we could make casts without difficulty between 33 and 36 yards under fishing conditions. With an HCH we were able to cast 30 yards without difficulty and when using a lighter line such as ICH and HDH, which would give certain advantages in the way of floatability and delicacy of casting, we were also able to cast 30 yards. Even using an IEH line casts between 25 and 27 yards were easily made.

This is extremely difficult information to give, for it is obviously affected by a number of factors, of which the most important are, the distances to be cast, the methods of casting, type of reel and amount of energy used by the caster, and the period of time that top weights are used. The figures given against each rod are therefore average figures. They may on occasions be slightly exceeded provided that the cast is not forced, that great care be taken to avoid over-run, and that the period of using relatively heavy baits is of short duration. We do here stress that playing heavy fish will have little effect on Milward rods but continuous casting with excess weights will "kill" any rod.

The Spincraft. Designed for use with the Bretton and other fixed spool reels for Trout, Sea Trout and Salmon, the Spincraft has the quick, smooth action necessary for casting light baits and handling big fish on fine lines. 

To obtain the action we required for this type of work, and in fact the perfect action for a multiplier used in any way, we reversed the taper under the handle. That is to say, instead of the cane being made progressively thicker, or parallel under the cork, on the Spinversa it is thinner at the butt cap than it is just above the handle.

These reels are made from solid drop forgings and are thus light and extremely strong. 




