

Greased Line Salmon Fishing

As introduced by the late Mr. A. H. E. Wood, of Cairnton. Greased line fishing is rapidly becoming the recognised method of summer salmon angling. It solves a problem for the salmon angler who wishes to fish with fly during the summer months when the water is dead low and clear and the temperature high. Sparsely dressed low water salmon flies are the usual lure. The line must be thoroughly greased. The normal cast in greased line fishing is straight across the stream. Such a cast allows the fly to drift downstream with an alluring motion, following the slightest turbulence of the water. The slack resulting from this action allows the fish to take the fly without feeling immediate resistance, the strike being deferred until the fish has almost returned to his "lie." The drift of the fly can be controlled by altering the "belly" of the "slack."

Suitable gear is, of course, essential, and we recommend that an outfit should be made up to the following description:—

- Correct size of fly is an essential. In cold weather use Low Water Flies size 4 to 6
 O.P., and in warm weather size 8 to 10 O.P.
- 2. Always present a side view of the fly to the fish.
- 3. Fish as slowly as possible, i.e., let the fly float downstream at a minimum speed, but watch and avoid "line drag."
- 4. Strike slowly and under water. Never strike overhead.
- 5. When a fish takes, drop the rod point downstream towards your own bank.

The "Impulse" Spinning Reels (Patent No. 16023). The easiest Rotary Drum Reel to manage, and the longest caster of light baits.

The action of throwing a bait with a Spinning outfit demands a force sufficient to let the bait pull out line fast enough to follow it through the air. This line has to pay off the drum which must be set in rotation. The "Impulse" reel provides a means of starting the drum into rotation with a flick of a lever at the moment of launching the bait, thus enabling a bait of limited weight to pull out more line than it could from an inert drum.

This pay-out would be dangerous if it were not provided that the "Impulse" reel cannot pay out slack line. The automatic self-applying brake only allows the drum to pay out line at the rate of the bait's flight.

The illustration shows a reel mounted on a rod, and alongside is another reel with the drum removed to show the simple, but ingenious mechanism.

The ratchet pawl is mounted on a lever "A" which is automatically cocked for the impulse by winding in the line. When the throw is made, a sharp pull on lever "A" with the finger, causes the pawl to set the drum in rotation.

The rotation is, however, resisted by the brake shoe "B," unless the shoe is held in the off position by some tension on the line through the loop "C" to which the shoe is linked. In the larger model the amount of tension on the line desired to ensure free paying out is easily adjusted to suit the weight of bait, and smooth operation of the brake is ensured by lubrication. In the smaller model this is unnecessary.

The reel may be used as a fly reel, the impulse lever providing an optional rachet.
