## GREENHEART TROUT RODS.

A good greenheart rod has qualities which are not to be found in a rod of any other material, and which make it so great a favourite with many fly fishers.

Provided genuine old greenheart is used, and the rod skilfully made, it is very hard to beat, and still harder to oust

from the affections of its user.

But the wood must be good and thoroughly seasoned, the making and "tuning" done by a man who fishes and knows the true feel of a rod—two features impossible of attainment by any mechanical means whatever.

For general river or stream fishing the best all-round length is 10 ft., and for loch fishing we find 10 ft. 6 in. and 11

ft. the favourite lengths.

For dry fly fishing 10 ft. is probably best, and a fairly

stiff rod should be selected.


The shorter rods have their special advantages, on the score of lightness, handiness in confined spaces, etc. Personal attention is given to selecting rods ordered, and we gladly assist intending purchasers to secure the most suitable rods for their requirements.

All the following rods are made at our own works, near London, tested, numbered and registered, but as slight variation is inevitable owing to the nature of the wood, etc., we cannot supply spare tops or other parts unless we have the rod to work to. In an emergency, a new top can be supplied if the ferrule off the broken one is sent as a guide.



## SPLIT CANE FLY RODS.

A perfect split cane fly rod is the highest attainment of the rod-maker's art, for to experience and ability must be added mechanical knowledge of an advanced nature.

Take, for example, the top joint of a light fly rod. It is made in six sections, and each must be fashioned so accurately that all will go together into a perfect hexagon, showing scarcely the line of joining. The correct tapering is even more delicate, for if any one part is too thick or too thin by the thickness of a cigarette paper, the "action" will be wrong and, unlike a wood rod, cannot be corrected by subsequent treatment.

It will be seen, therefore, that tools and gauges of a very high order are necessary, and these have been designed and made at our own works to ensure absolute accuracy in the preparing and fitting together of the sections of cane.

This high standard of workmanship with the choicest of materials has had surprising results on the strength and stability of split cane rods, and led to a very considerable reduction in their weight.

Steel centres are fitted to some of the following patterns in stock, and to any rod so ordered without extra charge, but the number of rods so fitted is steadily decreasing.

We invite comparison between any of our "Blue-Wrapt" rods and a similar rod by any other maker in the world, and we are perfectly confident of the result.

## COMPETITIVE TESTS.

It may be said with some truth that tournament casting in not fishing, but it is the more severe test from the manufacturers' point of view.

At the International Casting Tournament held in Paris in July, 1921, Farlow rods simply "swept the board" in the fly-casting events—taking at least three-fourths of all available prizes.

## THE "VICTORY."

An ideal rod for accurate light dry fly work where long casting is seldom necessary, but where clean casting combined with real pleasure and comfort on small streams or confined waters is desired. For wading up clear chalk streams and stalking shy trout this rod is admirable.

A new feature is the "all-round" winch fitting, which permits of the reel being fixed in various positions relative to the rings, so that the strain in the rod does not always continue in one direction; the weight of the reel will bring it under the hand naturally, but it is not necessary that the rings of the rod should always be in line with the reel.



## SPLIT CANE FLY RODS—continued.

## THE "PARIS-TOURNAMENT."

Tournament rods represent the maximum amount of strength and casting power possible in a given weight, and casting under Tournament conditions is a very severe test of durability and quality.

This rod is 9 ft. 6 in. long and within the regulation weight of 170 grammes, or about 6 ozs. The ferrules, handle and winch fittings are made as light and small as possible in order to get the greatest amount of strength in the rod itself.

At the International Casting Tournament held in Paris in 1921, this pattern rod took 3 out of a possible 4 prizes, including the first in both classes.

The extra amount of labour and time involved in getting these rods exact to weight makes them rather more expensive than the usual fly rods, but we believe them to be the most powerful 6 oz. fly rods in existence.


We designed this rod for our own use on Blagdon Lake, and both from bank and from boat have found it the best pattern we ever tried.

Cork grip long enough to allow a variety of hand positions, agate butt and end rings, nickelled steel intermediate bridge rings, etc.





The whole rod has a quick lively response that makes striking certain and accurate casting easy.



## THE "ANTENOR."

In comparing this rod with the  $9\frac{1}{2}$  ft. one on page 11, which is apparently the same weight, it should be borne in mind that the latter is fitted with lock-fast joints, which are considerably heavier than suction joints.

We believe this pattern to contain the maximum amount of strength and casting power, without loss of balance, in the minimum of weight. It is made of specially selected cane, and all fittings, ferrules, etc., are kept as light as possible, but it is entirely free from the weakness so often associated with so-called "light" rods.

It is an ideal dry fly rod, quick and clean to lift the line or strike a fish, with a beautiful even curve under strain.

### THE "SEXTILE."



Hexagonal built cane with steel centre.

Length, 10 ft. 3 joints with spare top. Weight, about 8 ozs.

This pattern is specially recommended to those who like a steel centred rod, as it has all the best characteristics of that class.

It is built on the stiffish side, with plenty of power for casting against a down-stream wind, but not heavy or too hard on fine tackle. Useful also for sea-trout fishing, and strong enough to cope with big fish.

The cork grip is sufficiently large, and with the reel fittings and socket for spear the balance is right, and the rod does not feel heavy or tiring in use.

"I have much pleasure in testifying to the merits of the little split cane rod which you built, for me, and can speak after giving it two years' hard work under varying conditions of weather and waters. It embodies all my ideas of what is required in a rod for delicate dry fly fly fly fly fly fly fly fly fishing; weight is reduced to a minimum; action is properly maintained from handle to point; casting power is quite sufficient for anything up to 20 yards; and lastly (points which I regard as of great importance) it will fish a short line as well as a long one, and the delicacy of its strike and play makes it possible for one who has a heavy hand to use fine drawn gut in safety, and this without too great sacrifice of power. II have killed trout of nearly 3 lbs. with this rod quite as quickly as I could have killed them with a heavier weapon.



Special Patterns for Loch Fishing, Sea Trout, etc. Lengths, 10 ft. 6 in. and 11 ft.



The tendency towards shorter and lighter rods continues in a marked degree and is perfectly sound. There is no need to use a long heavy rod where a shorter and lighter one will do the work equally well.

In boat fishing, however, as well as on many rivers, it is necessary to have as long a rod as can comfortably be used with one hand. When 9 or 10 ft. gut casts with two or three flies are used, it is almost indispensable to have a rod at least 10 ft. 6 in.; and for sea-trout fishing with the chance of a grilse, as often happens, the 11-ft. rod is best.

They are made in three joints with spare top, lockfast fittings, snake or bridge rings, cork handle, "Universal" reel fittings, etc., agate centred butt and end rings.


In action they are usually supplied with a fair amount of play evenly distributed, not "whippy," but not too stiff and tiring. If unable to choose one in person state what balance you like best and we will select accordingly.

The 13 ft. and 14 ft. rods are very much liked for sea-trout fishing where one is likely to meet with a grilse, as the rods are powerful enough for the larger fish while light and pleasant to use and capable of casting fine light tackle.

The 12-ft. rod is a very favourite length with many anglers who like a long rod for boat or bank fishing—something a little longer than the ordinary single-handed rod and yet not heavy or clumsy.

## ABOUT THE CARE OF RODS.

Rods should not be put away in damp covers. Take the joints out and wipe them dry, replacing only after the cover is quite dry. Take care that the tapes are so fastened that none of the joints is twisted in the cover, and, if possible, hang the rods up by a loop sewn on the top of each cover. Keep the ferrules clean but not greasy; if dirty, clean with a soft rag and a little plate powder. For lubricant use a piece of tallow candle or hard soap, rubbing the ferrule over lightly and wiping off with a soft rag.

Our suction joints fit so nicely that, if attended to in this simple fashion, they will always give satisfaction and never slip or turn.

Grasp the metal parts only (a little piece of sheet rubber in the hand is a great help) so as not to twist the wood or cane when putting the rod together or taking it apart.

We will execute repairs to any make of rod, and, having our own factory in London, can do so with the minimum of delay. Please address to 10 Charles Street, St. James's Square, London, S.W., enclosing a note of what requires doing and attaching your name and address securely.

A few weeks ago, fishing for trout in an Irish lough, I hooked a 6\$ lb. salmon, and after playing him over two hours, landed him. Not only did the rod last out, which was surprising, but the top was not even bent. ## SPLICED GREENHEART SALMON RODS.

## THE "TRAHERNE."

For real hard work there is nothing to equal a spliced greenheart rod, especially in spring fishing, or on big rivers where heavy lines and big flies are necessary; and spliced rods are specially adapted to "Spey" and "Switch" casting having the necessary extra strength in the top joint for that work. They are balanced rather heavy forward, with plenty of action down to the reel (although free from "whippiness"), and once properly timed will cast a long line with the minimum of exertion.

A spliced rod takes very little more time to put together than a ferruled rod, and it is only necessary to make sure that whatever binding is used the splice is quite firm. Never go on fishing if you feel the splice shaking; if it is loose at one point there is undue strain at another.

The Traherne rods are made in two lengths, viz., 17 ft. 4 in. and 16 ft. The former is an ideal rod for spring fishing, big rivers, Norway, etc.; and the latter is a very useful all-round rod for general work.

## Extract from Badmington Library on "Salmon and Trout."

The late Major Traherne wrote:-

"I have tried all sorts and sizes of rods, by various makers, but the one I am now using, and have used for many years, is, to my mind, perfection. It is a greenheart, in two splices, made by Farlow, and, if a rod is to be judged by its power of casting, it should be a good one.

"It is the one with which I won the first prize at the Fishing Tournament at Hendon, in July, 1884, for the longest overhead cast, with a cast of 45 yards I inch. To cast a long line a rod requires great lifting power, and my rod possesses this quality to a great extent, although, at the same time, it is not heavy enough to tire one in a hard day's fishing.

"I am at a loss how to describe it, but its virtue lies in an equal distribution of strength, in proportion, from the butt to the point.

- "A heavy butt, with no spring to it and with a weak top, is of little use for casting purposes beyond a certain distance. The spring should be felt, to a certain extent, to the bottom of the butt when casting; and I consider a rod which does not possess this quality of little or no value.
- "I have sent my favourite rod to Farlow's, and should anyone wish to try one made on the same lines he will be able to obtain it at that establishment.
- "A 17 foot rod is quite long enough for any ordinary casting for salmon, provided it is of sufficient power. A 16 foot rod is long enough for peel or grilse fishing, or even for salmon, when the water is low, and where fine tackle and small flies are required.

"Anyone who has read the reports of the Casting Tournaments at Hendon will see what marvellous casts were made with 16 ft rods, but they must be made of good stuff with plenty of lifting power.

"Fishermen of any experience will, of course, select a rod to suit their own fancy; but I strongly recommend the novice to made his first effort with a rod under his strength, and, above all things, to avoid using one with a weak, whippy top."

## PREPARED ADHESIVE TAPE FOR SPLICED RODS.

Specially strong tape on reels of 6 yards,  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch or  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch wide, 2/6 per reel.

This tape is also invaluable for temporary repairs, and a reel should form part of every angler's equipment.

#### SPINNING REELS.

Farlow's Patent Automatic Control Reel for Spinning for Salmon, Pike, Mahseer, etc.

(Patent No. 151733/20.)



#### FARLOW'S PATENT AUTOMATIC CONTROL REEL



This side view shows the line-control more clearly. The line is threaded through the round eye which slides freely backwards and forwards in the projecting arm.

This arm is pivoted on an inclined bearing and the inside portion carries a brake pad normally resting against the face of the line drum.

The pressure of the line in its course through the eye, from the reel to the first rod ring, raises the brake lever and allows the drum to run freely, but when the bait begins to slacken in its flight the brake comes into operation and stops any tendency to over-run.

The drum runs entirely on ball bearings and these ensure steady free movement as well as long life.


When sent out the reels are adjusted for medium size baits of, say,  $\frac{3}{4}$  oz. weight. For heavier baits a little more travel should be allowed to the brake pad and this can be done in a second by moving the milled screw on the back of the reel; but this does not in any way affect the delicacy of the line control which works as easily with a heavy as with a light bait.

A well-known French angler writes: "The reel is perfect for anything up to 50 yards," and it is very seldom one wants to cast as far as that.

For salmon spinning we recommend 50 yards of waterproofed "Heron" line, size 2, (see Section C) and 100 yards of "Holdfast" silk line spliced on as reserve and backing.

#### FARLOW'S NEW SPINNING REELS—continued.

No. 2 Pattern.



This is the same size as the No. 1 but made without the automatic control and with free, instead of caged in, drum. The outer edge of the revolving drum is thickened and rounded so as to give a smooth and effective surface for finger or thumb control.

The illustration shows the reel mounted on top of the rod near the upper end of the cork handle, the best position for use.



There are many different methods of casting with free-running reels, and when any one of these methods is mastered, casting becomes a great pleasure in itself and the chances of sport are much enhanced.

The thumb control shown above has much to commend it: the hand is in a perfectly natural position with no strain or stretch on any finger, the fleshy part of the thumb forms a most sensitive control for the reel and the slightest movement is effective; so that all the actions of casting, holding, releasing, controlling, stopping, are done without any apparent effort.


In winding in the line the left hand is brought forward as shown, keeping the reel on top of the rod; the first finger is free to guide the line evenly, the thumb rests on the brake handle ready to exert pressure in hooking and playing a fish.


A favourite device for securing comfort and accuracy is to visualise a clock face with your feet firmly planted on the centre of it and facing the figure XII. If you want your bait to land at, say, XI., bring your rod back to VI., start the cast there, "knock off" at III. and follow the bait round to XI. If X. is your objective, start at V., "knock off" at II. These examples are merely given to show the method suggested, but will be found helpful.

A No. 3 "Wire Plait" line (Section C) is a good choice for this reel.
