MARTIN'S "RIJESPOON" (Registered). This Spoon is the outcome of experiments in dark waters to obtain a lively glint from any angle. Its rounded ridges give reflections which blend to give an extreme liveliness over the whole surface of the spoon. See arrow heads in sketch. It is an excellent alternative to natural bait.
